Pastoral Ministry	<p>This is not so much a "<i>How to do it</i>" course as a "<i>Things to consider and be aware of</i>" course. As the lecturer I bring my own experience of 40 years as a practicing Pastor/leader of a church.</p> <p>Only a small number of students come to the college with a definite sense of a calling to be a Pastor but many of the principles we look at apply to all ministries. Whether a person is going to be an elder, apostle, prophet, evangelist, teacher, Sunday school teacher, youth leader, church administrator, Christian counsellor or social worker, an awareness of pastoral issues and concern and care for people is foundational for all effective Christian service.</p>	Paul Hodgson	12h
Pauline Letters Studies (1st Thessalonians)	<p>In this subject students are taught the Conceptual Study method and this is then applied to a practical analysis of Paul's letter to the church in Thessalonica. A foundation is laid by looking at the background to the letter and then key concepts are identified and applied to life and ministry. Having understood and mastered the Conceptual Study method this can then be applied to all future study and preparation of talks and sermons.</p>	Paul Hodgson	3h
Christian Ethics	<p>The subject provides an introduction to nine different ethical issues which might be morally and biblically controversial. Systematic Theology II*	The knowledge of God is an introduction to systematic theology, in which the student will consider the existence, self-revelation, nature and purpose of God. The focus of the first year's lectures is the revealed names and titles of God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. In the second year, the character and purpose of God form the main subject matter, followed by the trinity and the virgin birth. From these Biblical and theological bases all other branches of Christian knowledge and practice proceed.	Robert Mountford	18h
Working with Children II*	Working with Children examines children and the church in different cultural contexts and situations, their potential, their place in the local and universal church and how to minister to them effectively.	Gillian Saunders	7.5h
Youth Studies II*	The course focuses on more advanced aspects of youth ministry: from ministry culture to safeguarding, from the dynamics of transition to ministry progression, as well as a more advanced level of youth programme planning.	Simon Pastorello	6h
Creation and Evolution Origins II	We examine several arguments used to equate evolution theory with the Biblical account of creation, and the impact of evolutionism on Biblical doctrines. We discuss the potential impact and outcomes on the society of evolution, as scientific theory, social policy and as a politico-religious philosophy, and suggesting an alternative view based on the Biblical creation account.
